<b>Study course objective:</b> The objective of the course is to enable students to identify and analyze moral issues in different social and professional contexts; to be able to present appropriate arguments in regards to professional debates on moral issues; to structure and evaluate these discussions; formulate a recommendation based on the offered theories and give an assessment of moral issues in specific practices (health care, business, media, computer technology, judiciary, etc.).			
<b>Study course outcome:</b> Knowledge about the character of moral practice and the ability to have a correct moral assessment in the light of controversial moral issues and dilemmas. Knowledge about the opposing views that arise in debates about contemporary moral issues such as euthanasia, capital punishment, gender equality, world poverty, animal rights, etc. as well as possible solutions to moral confusion from the domain of professional practice, as well as the ability to argue critically about these issues.			
<b>Contents of the course</b> <i>Lectures</i> Concept and subject of applied ethics; ethical theory and ethical practice; main traditional and contemporary theories as well as structural concepts that have become part of everyday ethical language; the role of argumentation in ethics; ethical dilemmas; ethical codes; professional ethics; ethics of public services; corporate social responsibility; ethics of the media; ethics in education and research; bioethics; ethical aspect of handicap. <i>Practice classes</i> Discussions about ethical problems from everyday life.
