Study course objective: Acquiring basic knowledge and skills for independent critical approach to the critical issues of security and endangering individuals, the state and the international community.			
Study course outcome: The outcome of the course assumes knowledge of facts (describing, defining, understanding, and critical analysis of general concepts) in the field of security. Also, as the outcome of learning, the application of acquired knowledge in the everyday practice of dealing with security challenges, risks and threats is expected, evaluation of activities and behavior of different subjects in complex situations of security practice and developed synthetic ability, i.e. creation - as an ability to link the security knowledge corps through different levels of analysis from individual to global. Finally, students will be trained to evaluate the measures and activities of the state and individuals in eliminating the forms of the creation of threatening phenomena.			
Contents of the course			
<i>Lectures</i> Security as a scientific and teaching discipline; security as a function of the state, security system theory, activities, measures, forces, function; security threats, sources, forms, carriers; the position and problems of the security of our country in the modern world; international cooperation institutions in the field of security: UN, Interpol, Europol, NATO, Partnership for Peace; contemporary security risks and threats; organized crime, drug trafficking and weapons and computer crime; armed aggression as a form of threat to security; intelligence services; terrorism as a contemporary social phenomenon; the security system of Republic Serbia - theory, structure, security measures; the Security Service of Republic Serbia; security culture in the security system.			
<i>Practice classes</i> Improvement of acquired knowledge and Practice classes on certain issues that the students will encounter and address in practice. In the process of transferring knowledge, skills and developing abilities among students, during the practice classes, active, participatory and cooperative teaching will be applied, with the use of audio-visual technology and manipulative means.
