Study course outcome: Permanent adoption of knowledge and formed attitudes about the place and role of the army in a democratic society, the need for stipulating the civil- military relations and models of civilian democratic control of the army.			
Contents of the course <i>Lectures</i> Theory teaching: The concept of civil-military relations; the origin and occurrence of civil- military relations; theories of the role of the army in society; the concept of civil and democratic control of the army; parliamentary control of the army; budget control of the army; administrative control of the army; judicial control of the army; army and media; civil society and the military <i>Practice classes</i> Visit to the National Assembly of Republic Serbia; visit to the Ministry of Defense and the General Staff; simulation of the session of the Committee on Defense and Security of the National Assembly; simulation of proposing a military budget.
