Teaching course objective:			
<p>The objective of the course is acquiring knowledge about the role, functions and content of corporate security as one of the factors of national security, as well as the application of acquired knowledge in the field of systemic-structural analysis of security phenomena in the analysis of security needs and interests of corporate organizations, group and individual needs and interests in achieving corporate security objectives as a business function of an organization.</p> <p>The subject of Corporate Security should enable students to independently or as members of a team spot and solve security problems in the realization of business function of corporate security as a Requirements for the successful functioning of business entities and the national economy as a whole. Also, by developing the ability to apply international, European and national standards and regulations in the field of risk management, students are preparing to manage the integrated functions of security and corporate protection system.</p>			
Teaching course outcome:			
<p>Throughout the course, the students acquire the following knowledge and skills: getting to know the institutional and legal foundations of corporate security; linking the concept, objectives and functions of corporate security with the competencies of individual subsystems, segments and entities of the national security system; increasing the ability to detect and prevent corporate crime and strengthen the network of co-operation between internal corporate security mechanisms and institutional control subjects; developing analytical capabilities for assessing and analyzing security risks and for establishing, monitoring and controlling integrated security systems and protecting corporations in accordance with modern standards; analyzing transnational aspects of corporate security and their impact on the national security system of Republic Serbia; identifying, describing and distinguishing national aspects of corporate security of other countries; Analytical monitoring of compliance with the application of regulations and standards in the field of corporate security; Understanding corporate security in the context of regional security and in crisis and emergency situations.</p>			
Contents of the course			
<p>Conceptual determination of corporate security as part of the national system of security and economy as a whole; implementation of systemic-structural (organizational-functional) approach in the analysis and resolution of security problems of corporations; understanding the security of corporations in a globalized environment; endangering corporate security; risk assessment as an initial step in establishing a corporate security function; functions and structure of corporate security; business intelligence; corporate security and data security; managing business continuity in emergency situations; public-private partnership as a factor of corporate security; corporate security as part of national security systems of developed countries and countries in the region.</p> <p><i>Students' obligations</i></p> <p>Reading literature; active participation in the discussion; case studies and solving practical problems; making and defending essays / seminar papers; developing work presenting skills; colloquium.</p>
