Teaching course objective: The aim of the course is to introduce students to the essence of crime. The explanation of criminality as a legal and sociological category should enable students to understand the phenomenon and cause of crime, and determine the modalities of a formal social reaction to the reduction of this pathological social phenomenon, both at the individual and at the level of mass phenomenon.			
Teaching course outcome: Ability to identify in the state and society those phenomena that have the character of criminal activities, as well as the ability to timely preventive and operative action.			
Contents of the course			
<i>Lectures</i> The course content includes the study of crime and related delinquent and deviant behavior. It encompasses the history and development of theoretical criminological thought, with a special emphasis on the state of contemporary explanations. Indicates methods of studying criminality at the level of individual and mass phenomena. Explains criminality at the phenomenological and etiological level and proposes adequate measures of formal social control.			
<i>Practice classes</i> More detailed analysis of individual thematic units as well as analysis of individual examples from practice. Preparation of students for colloquiums and elaboration and defense of seminar papers.
