Module 2 - syntax - syntax constructions - phrases, independent and dependent clauses, as well as communicative clause function. Both modules include phonetics and the adoption of new vocabulary.			
<i>Practice classes</i> Practice classes, other forms of instruction. Training students to actively use the knowledge acquired during theoretical lessons.
