<b>Study course objective:</b> Students ought to become familiar with the philosophical reflection of moral phenomenon, to understand the nature and meaning of ethical knowledge in order to identify moral and ethical issues, solve ethical dilemmas, understand the role of values in a complex and diverse world, to understand what determines the correctness or inaccuracy of both our actions and public policies, understand the relationship between personal responsibility and the community. The aim is to develop and critically analyze the reasons that are stated in the defense of moral positions.			
<b>Study course outcome:</b> Understanding of central values and moral concepts in the context of leading ethical theories and their influence on the formation of contemporary social and political practice, which includes systematizing the concepts of good and correct behavior, their justification and promotion, as well as the determination of bad and inappropriate behavior.
