Study course objective: The objective of the course is to introduce students to security studies as a scientific discipline, through analyzing key changes in security thinking (personal, national, regional, global...). As part of the introduction into the discipline students will acquire basic knowledge about the emergence and development of security studies, different thematic areas and differentiated levels of research, basic theoretical approaches and security practices.			
Study course outcome: Acquiring and mastering the complex theoretical framework of security studies, comparing and distinguishing specific theoretical approaches, adopting key security concepts and their operationalization, developing a critical relationship and identifying the shortcomings of concrete theoretical approaches in security studies.			
Contents of the course			
<i>Lectures</i> Intellectual precursors and the emergence of security studies. Conceptual security analysis. Classic theoretical approaches in security studies. Expanding and deepening the concept of security. Contemporary theoretical approaches.			
<i>Students' obligations</i> Reading literature; active participation in the discussion; solving practical problems; making and defending essays / seminar papers; developing skills in presenting paper; colloquiums.
