Teaching course objective: Conceptual articulation and operationalization of knowledge in the field of social activity, where emphasis is placed on the analysis of political values and institutions, different dimensions of public opinion and the way of functioning of political parties.			
Teaching course outcome: Ability of a clear, analytical view of the contemporary political environment from a sociological point of view.			
Contents of the course			
<i>Lectures</i> An overview of the historical shaping of political ideals and values (justice, freedom, equality, etc.), or contemporary political ideologies (liberalism, socialism, conservatism, fascism / Nazism) as well as pre-modern and modern political institutions; analysis of contemporary processes of social stratification and accompanying political conflicts; possible models of integration and political association in the modern world of globalism. In addition, the course curriculum also includes the principle division of traditional and contemporary state forms and their principles of legitimacy, the genesis of public opinion and modern parties, as well as their relationship with the sovereign state and civil society. Special emphasis is put on domestic circumstances, i.e. the emergence and development of the Serbian state and its political institutions, and in particular the value forms that were being created accordingly.			
<i>Practice classes</i> In the practical part of the course, students apply the acquired theoretical knowledge making an analysis of contemporary political trends in the country, the region and the world.
