Contents of the course			
<i>Lectures</i> Familiarizing with the theoretical context of distinguishing metaphysical and specialist knowledge, the emergence of science and schism in science, as well as the basic characteristics of social sciences; getting acquainted with the subject of sociology research and the scope of sociological knowledge; a historical overview of the emergence of the modern era and the idea of society; problems of the sociological method (approaches to the study of society); sociological theories; interaction of individuals and society (social groups, institutions, politics and their context).			
<i>Practice classes</i> In the practical part of the course students have the opportunity to deepen the acquired theoretical knowledge in the direction of researching relationships in contemporary society and re-examining the adequacy of certain rules of social behavior.
