Contents of the course			
<i>Lectures</i> The content of this course in the part called penology includes studying the legal consequences of delinquent and deviant behavior. It encompasses the history and development of theoretical penological thought. It shows the system of execution of criminal sanctions and measures of alternative punishment. The victimology part of the study course examines the role of the victim and gives knowledge about victimization and prevention of victimization in contemporary conditions.			
<i>Practice classes</i> More detailed consideration of individual thematic units through seminars and study visits.
