Subject aim: The subject aim is complete understanding of the form of human communication in social construction of reality, and the role of the media in society in general, especially in social control of modern in area of security with view of their ambivalent potential role in creating security and insecurity		
Subject outcome: Viewing and understanding of the role of human communication in social construction of reality in general and especially in area of security. Thanks to adopted knowledge and skills they understand an ambivalent role of the media in creation and building, or and in violating security, how in most general level in the sense of promoting and maintaining social system of values both and in stigmatization of wholly concrete appearances of its violating. Also, they know potential influence of media on individual subjects of the security system. These findings are of use in critical approach and analysis of individual security phenomena and they can manage to transferring in teaching-educational process.		
Subject content: Role of the different ways of communication in social construction of reality; media relation, endangerment of security, especially of the crime and penal justice: role of the mass media in social construction of reality, media constructed picture of security. specially criminal one, - accordance with official data, context of crime and justice in daily informative media and entertainment media , influence of informative media on processing current cases, influence of media to the violence level and crime in society, media and terrorism, influence of media on creation and raising of security culture, media presentation of police, security services, courts and penal institutions, media and victims, role of mass media in crisis situations, computer networks and security (technical-technological, socially psychological and other aspects).
