<i>Theory classes</i>			
The concept and origin of the national security system, structure of the national security system, determinants of the national security system, role of the army in the national security system of Serbia, role of the police in the national security system, intelligence and security sector, emergency response services and through study visits to state authorities in the field of national security.			
<i>Practice classes</i>			
Practice classes are conducted through the analysis of positive legal regulations in compliance with which the national security system of Serbia is constituted and with the study visits to certain security sectors at the level of the Republic and the City of Belgrade.
